Presentation	Update on Brock University Evaluation of Niagara Prosperity Initiative (NPI): Chris Walsh, Research Coordinator, Brock University
	Have been contracted to assess impact of NPI – connecting with community to gather various perspectives in order to shape the understanding of how NPI has functioned
	Looking at processes – what NPI uses to choose, track and follow NPI projects
	Impact – what impact the projects that have been funded have had on the community
	Need – see what need there is in the community and how NPI has fit into that need

To date have conducted hundreds of interviews with participants, clients, service providers, etc. Have conducted an environmental scan to understand poverty in Niagara and where people get their information from regarding poverty in Niagara, as well as an academic literature review Looking to review how NPI reports data and evaluates themselves, as well as how the grants themselves are reviewed by community members and whether it is the best approach Along with assessing NPI's impact on organizations, etc. this project is assessing the potential impact of NPI's work on people living with a low income in Niagara through a broad telephone survey to a random sample of Niagara residents living below the Low Income Measure (for more information on LIM see here, https://www150.statcan.gc.ca/n1/pub/75f0002m/2012002/lim-mfreng.htm) • The evaluation will be consolidated in a report published in January 2021, that publishes findings, expert commentary, and recommendations to the Region regarding NPI and poverty in Niagara In second half of this year, there will be further community consultations presenting early findings, but the final report will be available to download online, but will also be distributed by NPRN If you would like more information about this evaluation, please see the project website: https://brocku.ca/npi-evaluation/ If you would like to connect with the NPI Evaluation team to provide input or a request, please email Rachel or Chris Ontario Poverty Reduction Strategy Community Engagement Session: Sandy Dupuis, Manager of Compliance and Community Presentation Engagement, Community Services, Niagara Region, and Michelle Johnston, Policy Advisor, Community Services, Niagara Region Here to ensure that the Region's submission to the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services (MCCSS) is informed by the non-profit sector Facilitation exercise to gather input regarding: what is working in programming from the provincial government regarding poverty alleviation; what should the province start doing; what is not working?
